## TOWN OF GRAND ISLE SCHEDULED TOWN COUNCIL MEETING WEDNESDAY JANUARY 8, 2025 6:00 P.M.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor David Camardelle who led the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag. Leonard Ray followed with a prayer. Roll call was as follows:

David Bradley with the USACE was recognized and reports on the following: Along with David Bradley was Amy Dixon and Paul A Varnado. 1.) Concerning crossovers along the hurricane protection levee. 2.) Clay filled geotextile 16,000 LF core installed 3.) Request for 30-40 new breakwaters to bridge the gap. 4.) Completed repairs (stone contract) in September 2024.

Ti-Joe Augustin was recognized and reports on the following: Mardi Gras Parade will be March 2, 2025 at 1:00 p.m. Starting on Blackberry Lane moving east to Oak Lane. Joint motion was made to allow the GI Mardi Gras Parade access to use LA Hwy 1.

Total paid to date \$1,269,445.05 Old Jail Bunkhouse — Joint motion was made to pay request no. 2 in the amount of \$53,037.00. Motion by Council Member Brian Barthelemy seconded by Council Member Michael Scioneaux and unanimously agreed to pay change order no. 2 in the amount fo\$4,500.00. Multiplex Building — Motion by Council Member James Cheramie seconded by Council Member Brian Barthelemy and unanimously agreed to pay final payment in the amount of \$31,235.20. Jackson Lane Pump Station — All permits are received. Project is shovel ready. Assisting with LITACorp/Grand Isle DOT project. Capital Outlay Request FY 2025-2026 — Road Rehabilitation, Central Island Drainage Project, Public Housing. Orange Ln Pump —Contractor will have equipment mobilized to the project on January 9, 2025. PPDR— 28 total homes have been submitted. Bids will be in January 2025. NTP will be next meeting from the town. Baseball Field — Joint motion was made for Del-Con to

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place red clay onto Baseball Field in the amount of \$34,040.00. Joint motion was made for Del-Con to place red clay onto Softball Field in the amount of \$23,360.00. Joint motion was made to give approval to GIS Inc to provide and pay \$3,700.00 for 60 yards of red clay.

Carles Esponge with the Street Department was recognized: Mayor Camardelle commends the great work the outside crew is doing.

Ronnie Sampey with the GIGC was recognized and reports on the following: 1.) Received a tree grant in the amount of \$5,024.00. Planted and gave 340 trees among the town. 2.) Community Garden is planted with winter vegetables.

Joint motion was made to cancel the regular scheduled council meeting on 1-22-2025.

Joint motion was made to approve the use of The GI Multiplex for the GI Alumni Association dance 2-8-2025 and all fees waived.

Council Member Brian Barthelemy request/reports: **1.)** Asked if the outside crew can spray ditches. **2.)** Status of DOTD complete the shoulders of Highway One. **3.)** Propose a handicap parking lot by Humble RD crossover. Two van cement pad and 20'x20' pavilion ADA compliance. Motion by Council Member Brian Barthelemy seconded by Council Member Michael Scioneaux to proceed in getting Attorney Chip Cahill to give the town the legal aspects. Council Member James Cheramie voted nay.

Mayor's report: 1.) Speaking to Governor Landry to possibly raise Highway One. 2.) Orange Lane pump station will help with the flooded area that Landy Pump Station has been doing on it's own. 3.) Speaking to our Senators and Representatives to get the USCG buildings/units here in Grand Isle for Affordable Housing.
